July 15th 4D1G

July 16th & 17th Rick Newton

Rick has carried the cross around the world. His heart is for people; his thrill is leading someone to Christ. He was invited to pass out Bibles to government leaders inside the Kremlin in Moscow. While in Russia he gave away 75,000 Bibles. He has been arrested in Egypt, shot at in Jerusalem, and had a 30 cal. rifle stuck in his face in El Salvador. He was raised in Miami, Florida, thrown out of his home as a teenager, and grew up during the bitter violence in the 60's. In 1972 he committed his life to Christ and began his ministry to the unsaved.

July 18th Mike Gantt

Mike pastored the Agape Christian Fellowship in Brattleboro, VT for 38 years. He has a heart for the Lord. He never knew his father, but when he was a teen God provided a friend and mentor in his pastor.

For thirty years he has been involved in ministry in various places in Africa. For more than 10 years Mike has worked as an advocate in Kenya for the Immanuel Christian School for the Deaf. He and his wife have been married over 50 years and stay busy with their large family. He has written several books.

Nick Moorhead was born in Boston and grew up in Everett, Massachusetts. While attending Tremont Temple Baptist Church he was licensed for ministry in that American Baptist Church. Afterward he attended John Brown University in Siloam Springs, Arkansas, graduating with a Bachelor of Arts Degree. He received the Master of Divinity Degree from New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary. While completing seminary training he was ordained by numerous Baptist and United Methodist churches in North Carolina, Texas, and Arkansas. For the past 30 years he has resided in North Carolina.

Tom Savastano is co-founder and president of FirstLoveWorks, a nonprofit ministry dedicated to providing people the opportunity to experience the love and presence of God, and to seeing revival and awakening in New England and beyond.
